After looking at the attachments you sent showing the location of the signs your company proposes to erect, we have no objection to the erection of these signs and state that a permit is not needed from CDOT. An On-Premise sign is defined as follows:

Any signing on this property that will be visible to I-70 must be On-Premise in nature and only advertise goods, services and activities available on that property and must comply with any other applicable rules governing outdoor advertising in Colorado per state rules 2 CCR 601.3.

As your sign will be located directly on the property, it does comply with the Colorado state rules.
